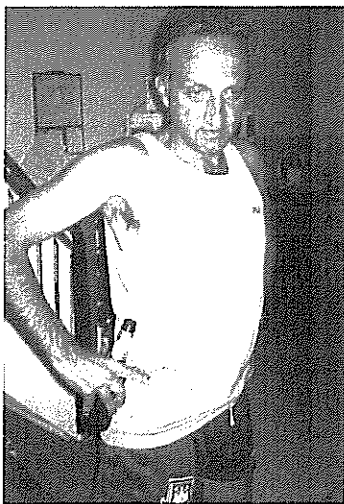
Harry Gill

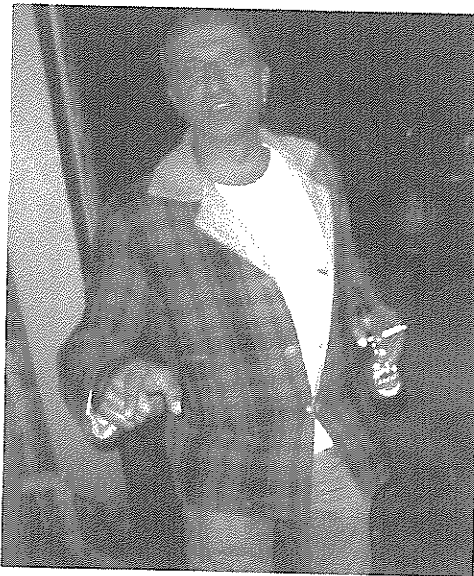

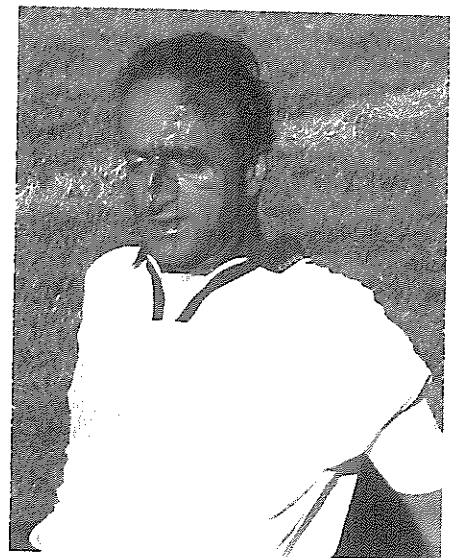

Report

After two consecutive 3rd place finishes in State 3, season 2013 was going to prove to be a tough ask. A loss of players at MUSC is something you take for granted. With a few players moving on and others going back overseas and others moving to the State 5 squad it was a younger squad that was going to take the field for the Uni in season 2013.

Preseason was tough with a multitude of players coming to the club. Kick-arounds started in November and continued for five weeks. We picked up a couple of players during those kick-around sessions. Pre-season started in mid January and there were quite a few players trying out for the senior squads. It was apparent that the quality and depth of our squad would be tested in season 2013. Players that stayed on from previous seasons were Alex King, Brant Mitchell, Emir Ameti, Fikret Causevic, Maz Nagasaka, Nick Posada, Rai Spiller, Tom Mullumby and Warren Evert. The addition of players from the lower squads in Ciaran Brady, Daniel Schepisi and Patrick Kastner. The new additions included Carlo Cirillo, Chaz Talboys, Giovanni Poltronieri, Joey Robben, John Mulqueeny, Matt White, Mike Reinhardt, Simon Leversha and Won Choi.

The season started reasonably well with a draw, loss and win in the 1st three rounds. We had some decent games and played some good football early, however lacked the cutting edge and defensive mistakes were costing us in games that we should have been taking points. Melvin Thancanamootoo was drafted into the squad after the loss of 3 players in Joey, John and Nick. After an indifferent start we had some excellent come from behind wins against Altona City and Sporting Whittlesea followed by a hard earned draw away to Sunbury.

From Rd 9-11 we lost three games on the trot. We were competitive however we needed an impetus of players that would help revive our season. In came Ian Chapple and Robbie Hurst from the Sportlived program. Ahmed Azzam, Erik Hamre and Leo Correa were chased to come back and help the club out of the predicament that we were in. After an initial loss to Yarraville which made it 4 losses on the trot we were able to claw ourselves out of the hole we had dug.

In the next 10 games we had five wins. A 2-1 win against Banyule City, a come from behind win against Altona City, a 1-0 win away to Sporting Whittlesea, a 3-2 win away to Geelong and a 4-1 win at Hume United. In that period we also had three draws against Cairnlea, Moreland United and Westvale. Our only two losses were against North Sunshine and Sunbury United in which we probably deserved a point on both those occasions.

We had numerous games throughout the season where we came back from deficits to either win the game or take a point. The first was against Altona City where we were 2-1 down with 15 minutes to go and came away with a 3-2 win. We also did it against them in the second round when we went 2-0 down and came away with a 3-2 win. Our best comeback was against Cairnlea who were on a high going down 3-0 just after the break and coming back to equalise 3-3 in the final minutes of the game.

There were some excellent performances throughout the season however our most consistent player throughout the season was Emir Ameti who deservedly won the B & F. Chaz Talboys as a CB in the second half of the year was excellent. Rai Spiller was excellent up until his injury and Brant Mitchell and Warren Evert had good consistent years.

Robbie Hurst was a gem and played some quality games in our push to rise up the ladder. Leonardo Correa bagged 4 goals in his comeback and helped provide some structure to our forward line. Even though Erik Hamre, Ahmed Azzam and Will Osborn played limited games they had influence in us gaining the points that were required. Ciaran Brady had an indifferent season however was influential in certain games especially his match winning performance against Altona City. Alex King returned after his holiday overseas and played some quality games in midfield. Needs to work on his commitment and consistency, however should be a starting midfielder for the club.

Giovanni Poltronieri had some quality games especially late in the season, however his injury kept him out of the squad for long periods of time. Mike Reinhardt had a solid start to the year but injury late in the season kept him from training and his form dipped. Melvin Thancanamootoo had some decent games but injury and his move abroad kept him to limited appearances. As for Daniel Schepisi his pre season form was terrific and then injury, holidays and commitment curtailed his season. Matt White was a quality LB that regrettably should have been given more appearances. Fikret Causevic disappeared halfway through the season after being dropped from the squad. Ian Chapple had some indifferent form but played four games in the seniors and had a great attitude towards the team and the game. From the younger brigade there were glimpses of some quality from Maz Nagasaka, Patrick Kastner, Tom Mullumby and Simon Leversha. Hopefully these players can step up and make what could be a solid team over the next few years.

I would like to thank all involved at the club from the committee, to the coaches and all the players that have put in the time and the effort to achieve a satisfactory result. My expectations are higher and I would like the club to try to push for promotion, and this needs a lot of work, commitment and effort from all involved. This would mean a change in philosophy at the club and the ability to attain and retain players at the higher level. How do we do this if we are competing against teams that offer financial rewards to their players? The answer is Facilities!!!

Thank you to Duncan Ryan, George Trajkovski and Larry Quiroga for their assistance throughout the year. A special thanks to Boris Ivanov who throughout the year put in a solid coaching effort during training and prior to games. He also filled in due to my absence on game days between Rd 13-16. Thank you also to Andrew Kotsos who again did an outstanding job on the Votes throughout the season.

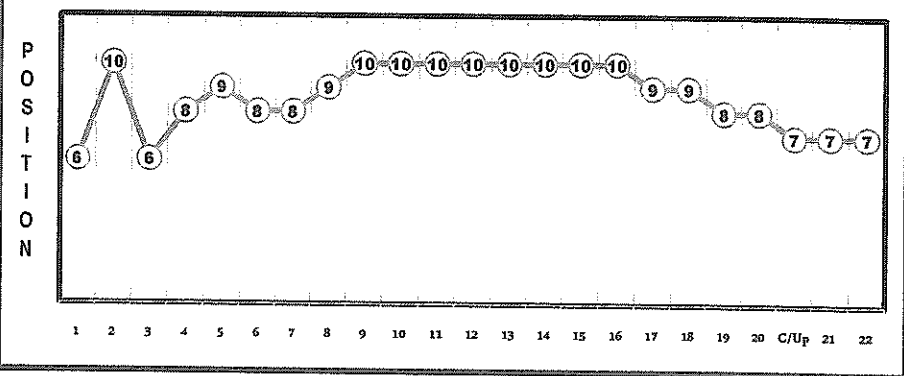

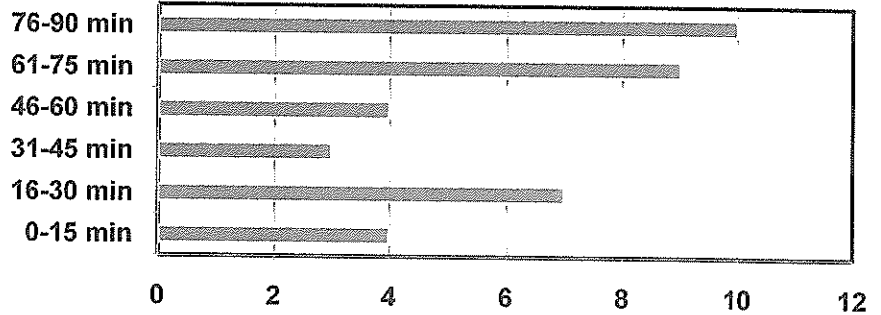

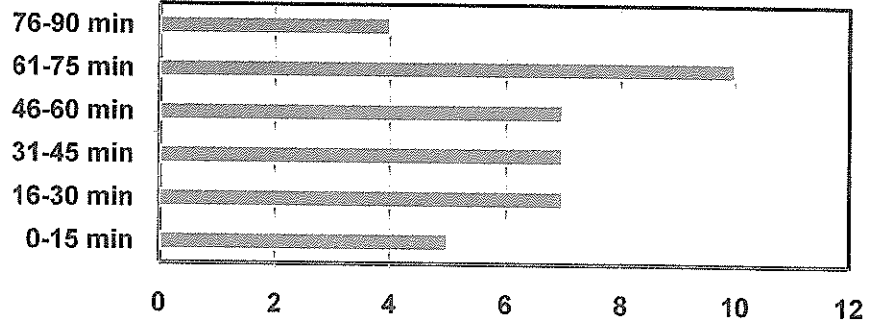
LADDER POSITION BY ROUND



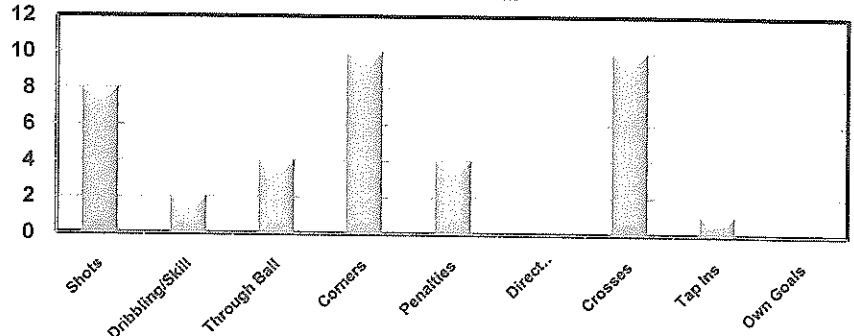
TIME GOALS SCORED

COACHES REPORT

The season started brightly for us with 7 points from the first 3 games. The next 3 successive games were losses against the teams that turned out to be the top 3. We never quite recovered from this.

Whilst the squad came back thereafter with 5 wins and a draw, we again struggled against the top teams in the second half of the season. However, a highlight was a hard fought 1-0 win against the eventual champion, Old Scotch, their only defeat all season.

Finishing fourth was ultimately somewhat disappointing, being the same position as last year but, happily, with 1 more point. The 8 point margin to third and the 10 point margin to fifth tells the tale of the season, that the top 3 teams rarely dropped points and it was always going to be difficult to catch them once we lost to each of them.

Having the most miserly defence last season, I deliberately set about working on our attacking play this year. This unfortunately caught us short in defence, at times. I attempted to combat this by switching to a deep defending system, crowding our half when not in possession, for the duration of the second half of the season. This generally bore positive results, but with some exceptions. We played a counter-attacking game, with the option of our usual possession football if a swift counter-attack was not available. We orchestrated this almost to perfection in a stunning 4-0 highlight win over South Yarra at Fawkner Park.

Having only retained 5 players from last year's squad was not going to deter us as we picked up some very good recruits. Best and Fairest winner and runner up, Richo and Carl, drove our midfield with their fitness, skill and smart play. Captain Isaac was unable to join us until midway through the season but proved a tower of strength at the back, Finn was a great find as a very consistent right back, following instructions to a tee and causing problems for the opposition as an extra attacker. Yousef was an outstanding striker before ultimately, and deservedly, being poached by Larry. Jaime contributed much with his silky skills and 14 goals. It was very useful to have a regular goalkeeper in Tom Miller who was extremely consistent, reliable and technically strong, albeit that the outstanding individual goalkeeping performance was from Steve in the win against Old Scotch.

A particularly pleasing aspect for me as coach was the improvement of Henry Robertson over the two seasons. Whether playing on either flank or up front, his attitude, footballing smarts, stamina and speed were a significant contribution to the team and its flexibility. All in all, this year's squad may have lost some excellent players but generally retained last year's style founded on compressing space when without possession and expanding space when in possession. This continuity was enhanced by the reliability of stalwarts from 2012, Dave, Lachie and Brian.

A personal highlight was playing my 650th competitive game for the club at all levels in the final match, and enjoying scoring for the first time in three seasons. A much bigger personal highlight was being allowed to continue my role nurturing and mentoring the abundant young talent available to this magnificent football club.
